Biblical Descriptions

NIV- Revelation 6:3,4

³ When the Lamb opened the second seal, I heard the second living creature say, "Come!" ⁴ Then another horse came out, a fiery red one. Its rider was given power to take peace from the earth and to make people kill each other. To him was given a large sword.

Notes

The interpretation seems open since we only know the color of the horse, intent of the rider, and that the rider has a sword.

In general, my understanding of this rider is that he represents internal division- civil infighting-rather than war for conquest (see the first rider). My approach to the visuals was to design a rider that looked older, more devious, and had a few scars.

³ And when he had opened the second seal, I heard the second beast say, Come and see.

⁴ And there went out another horse that was red: and power was given to him that sat thereon to take peace from the earth, and that they should kill one another: and there was given unto him a great sword.

The horse is smaller and armored, representing (possibly) the diminished might of an empire and the desire to protect it from internal foes.

Final Reminder:

Again, much of this is my own assumption and should not be taken as absolute! Perhaps with further study and research better alternatives will present themselves. As usual, I strongly encourage Bible students to consider my underlying questions and assumptions for themselves and determine if the concept I've presented works.
