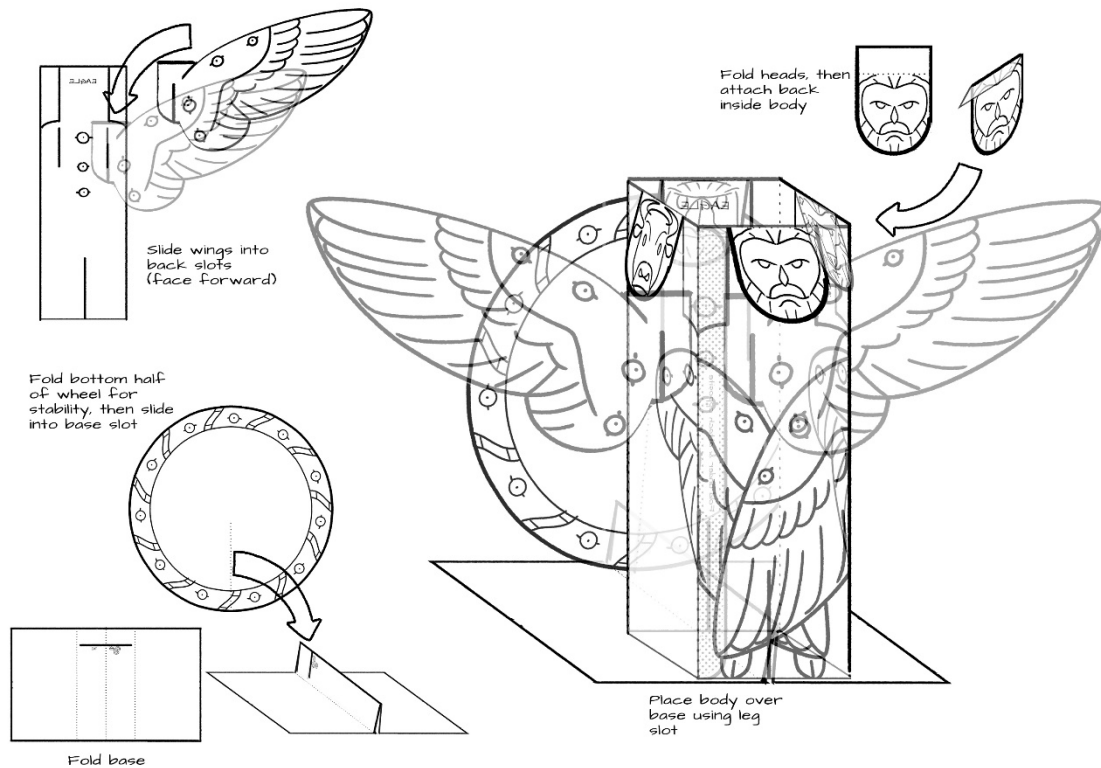

THE CHERUBIM- INSTRUCTION SHEET (5/5)

The Idea: Familiarize students with the various aspects of the cherubim of Ezekiel 1 (&10) with this simple craft.

What tools will I need?

You'll need a computer and a black and white printer to download and print the templates. Beyond that, we recommend:

1) 8.5x11 cardstock for printing. This is a heavier, more durable material to craft with. It's recommended, but not necessary. All prototypes are created using standard printer paper to ensure that they'll work.

2) Exact-o knife for cutting.

3) Crayons, markers, or Colored Pencils. All templates are designed to be colored in by students. This isn't necessary, but might be preferred.

4) Tape or glue.

Any best practices suggested?

- A) For younger children especially, teachers may want to stick with the simplest version of a particular module (for example, stick with a basic boat, and skip the mast and sails) to allow for time to color.
- B) For younger children especially, consider cutting out the papercraft modules ahead of time for safety and for the sake of time.
- C) Consider putting a craft together the night before to time things out, and to ensure you know how to assemble the craft yourself.

- E) Have fun... but mostly we hope these crafting ideas will help build interest and discussion around the Bible!
